# TULARE JOINT UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM 2024 INFORMATION PACKET

This information packet has been prepared to assist entering 9<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> grade Tulare Joint Union High School District students and parents in the registration for the Summer School Program. Information herein is reliable at the time of printing, but due to financial and other constraints, is subject to change.

The deadline to apply is Friday, May 3, 2024

#### STATE GUIDELINES AND DISTRICT PRIORITIES

The State of California specifically regulates the types of offerings for Extended Year programs. These regulations are listed as follows:

□ Extended year program hours can be used for other local priorities, including pupils at risk of being retained, those with low test scores, graduating seniors, those who would otherwise not graduate with their class, etc.

#### Students will be placed in courses based on the following District priorities:

- 1) Placement in courses that assist students in meeting **graduation requirements** for those students who are not on track to graduate.
- 2) Placement in courses that assist students in meeting **A-G requirements** for those students who wish to take regular year courses that would otherwise not fit into their schedule.

#### APPLYING FOR SUMMER SCHOOL

Counselors will provide this summer school information packet and an application to their students.

In order to receive appropriate priority, counselors will assist students in selecting classes based on the above listed State Law and District Priorities

#### SUMMER SCHOOL DATES, BELL SCHEDULE & LOCATION

Summer school will be held at **Tulare Union High School** on the following dates from 7:30 am to 3 pm:

1<sup>st</sup> semester: June 12, 13, 14, 17, 18, 20, 21, 24, 25 (9 days) 2<sup>nd</sup> semester: June 26, 27 & July 1, 2, 3, 8, 9, 10, 11 (9 days)

#### **Summer School Regulations**

The following regulations must be adhered to by any student in the summer program:

- All regular school rules apply, including the conduct code, dress code and the truancy/tardy policy. Failure to follow these rules may result in dismissal from the program.
- Students who elect to use Summer School to accelerate required coursework for high school
  graduation in the areas of Math, Science, Social Studies, World Language and Fine Arts will be
  allowed to complete only one (1) course from each of these departments to count toward
  graduation requirements. English can only be taken as a make-up class.
- A summer class is essentially a year-long program that has been condensed into 18 days. A single day's absence from summer school equates to over a week's absence from the regular school. <a href="Any student who misses more than two days of summer school will be dropped from the program">Any student who misses more than two days of summer school will be dropped from the program</a>. This includes absences for illness and family vacation. There are no "excused" absences during the summer program.
- Students not in attendance by 7:30 a.m. on Wednesday, June 12 2024, will be dropped from the summer program. Re-enrollment for dropped students will be on a space available basis.
- Final exams will be conducted on the last day of each semester. Students must be present and
  must participate in finals in order to receive credit. <u>There will be no exceptions made for</u>
  <u>students wanting to be dismissed prior to the last day of Summer School.</u> Please plan
  family vacations and other summer events with this in mind.

We understand that there are numerous valuable opportunities that take place during the summer months. In some cases, such opportunities conflict with the summer school dates. Students should not apply to the program if they cannot commit to the entire term of the class.

#### **Summer School Grades**

Grades will be distributed to the students by their teacher on the last day of each summer semester. The grades will also be posted on the student transcripts by the first day of August. Any questions regarding summer grades after the summer program has ended, contact your student's counselor.

#### **How To Know If You Are In Summer School**

ENROLLMENT WILL BE DONE ON A LOTTERY BASIS PRIORITIZED BY GRADE LEVEL THEN BY THE DISTRICT PRIORITIES IN COURSES WHERE DEMAND EXCEEDS SPACE AVAILABILITY.

Summer School applications will be processed in May. <u>Turning in an application does not guarantee enrollment</u>. Meeting the registration deadline, demand for classes, and registration priorities are all factors in enrollment. All students who apply will be notified of either their placement or non-placement by <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>June 4</u>, <u>2024</u>. Students who are not placed in a summer course will be given an opportunity to fill empty seats on the first day of the program through a lottery system. More information will be distributed to those students regarding this process.

#### APPLYING FOR SUMMER SCHOOL @ College of the Sequoias

College of the Sequoias (COS) offers a variety of courses for high school students in their summer school program. TJUHSD students can take these COS courses for advancement during the summer. Follow these steps to apply:

- New students will need to complete a COS admissions application for the term they
  intend to enroll. Returning students will need to reapply only if they have not
  enrolled in classes for two consecutive semesters.
- Complete the Concurrent Enrollment Permission Form. This form must be signed by all responsible parties – student, high school designee, and parent. Once the form is signed, please submit to concurrentenrollment@cos.edu
- Enroll in courses. Students cannot enroll in courses until Step 1 and Step 2 are completed. Click here to access our registration help video series. Concurrent enrollment students may enroll on or after the concurrent enrollment student priority registration date. Click here to view registration dates and deadlines.
- Review your schedule on BannerWeb (accessible through the MyGiant Universal Login)to ensure that you are registered for your course(s)
